

Bristol [®] Amitriptyline belongs to a group of medicines called tricyclic antidepressant drugs. These medicines alter the levels of chemicals in the brain to relieve the symptoms of depression. Bristol[®] Amitriptyline is used: to treat the symptoms of depression.

It is the most widely used TCA and is an efficacious treatment for major depressive disorder (clinical depression).

Bristol [®] Amitriptyline is a tricyclic antidepressant used to treat mental depression. In multiple sclerosis it is frequently used to treat painful paresthesias in the arms and legs (e.g., burning sensations, pins and needles, stabbing pains) caused by damage to the pain regulating pathways of the brain and spinal cord.
