Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) is a medicine which is used in treatment of migraine attacks. Tolfenamic acid (TA) is one of the class of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs).

Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) is used to relieve pain in migraine attacks. Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) should not be taken to prevent migraine attacks from occurring but it should be taken as soon as a migraine attack starts. For more information about when to take Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) and how much to take speak to your prescriber or pharmacist.

Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) is a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (also known as an NSAID).

- It is used to treat migraine headaches.
- Take one tablet as soon as possible at the first sign of an attack. You may take a second tablet after 1-2 hours if needed.

It is not clear what causes migraine. It is thought that some chemicals in the brain increase in activity, and as a result parts of the brain then send out confused signals which result in the symptoms of migraine.

It is also not clear why people with migraine should develop these chemical changes and many migraine attacks occur for no apparent reason. In some people, however, there may be things which trigger an attack, like certain foods or drinks.

Hylotram® (tolfenamic acid) is an NSAID used to relieve pain in migraine attacks. It works by blocking the production of irritant chemicals during a migraine attack.
