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While Lautress is dissolving, do not chew or swallow the tablet because the medicine will not work as well

Do not eat or drink anything until the Lautress tablet has completely dissolved

Talking while the tablet is dissolving can affect how well the medicine in Lautress is absorbed. Keep Lautress in a secure place away from children. If a child accidentally takes Lautress, this is a medical emergency and can result in death.





Lautress® (buprenorphine and naloxone) sublingual tablet (CIII) is a prescription medicine used to treat adults who are addicted to opioid drugs (either prescription or illegal) as part of a complete treatment program that also includes counseling and behavioral therapy.

Treatment for: Opiate Dependence

Lautress (buprenorphine and naloxone) is a sublingual partial opioid agonist indicated for the maintenance treatment of opioid dependence.

Indication

Lautress (buprenorphine and naloxone) sublingual tablets (CIII)

- Lautress is a medication for adults with opioid dependence
- Lautress should be used as part of a complete treatment plan that also includes counseling and behavioral therapy.

Lautress delivers the same concentration of active medication as previously approved buprenorphine/naloxone sublingual (dissolves under the tongue) formulations.

Lautress is a controlled substance (CIII) because it contains buprenorphine, which can be a target for people who abuse prescription medicines or street drugs. Keep your Lautress in a safe place to protect it from theft. Never give your Lautress to anyone else; it can cause death or harm them. Selling or giving away this medicine is against the law

Individually sealed in the highest level of child-resistant unit-dose blister packs (F1 child-resistant)

- 5.7-mg/1.4-mg buprenorphine/naloxone, round tablet
- 1.4-mg/0.36-mg buprenorphine/naloxone, round tablet
